**Minutes of the UCC Church Council Meeting
Monday, April 5, 2021 6:00PM – UCC Church**

1. **Devotional/opening prayer** – Pastor Jeannie Douglas opened the meeting with a prayer.
2. **Introductions/Attendance** – UCC Council Members Kaylene Kloehn, Jim Williams, Tina Clegg, Jamie Darkow, Dave Thiel, and Clint Micke; Pastor Jeannie Douglas; Guests, Wally Schmidt.
3. **Review opening protocol of the church**
 - a. The council reviewed the protocol and discussed small changes to be made.
 - b. The council voted to approve the continuation of mask wearing in the church following the CDC Guidelines.
4. **Snow Removal**
 - a. Following the resignation of Sandy Cuff, the council decided to begin a search for a member(s) of the congregation who have the ability, equipment, and willingness to snow plow the parking lot and remove snow from the sidewalks, trash area, and any other necessary places around the property during the winter months. If need be, the council will be seeking outside bids in June.
4. **Other orders of business/open discussion**
 - a. The council voted to approve the continuation of alternating weekends of Traditional and Praise Services until Labor Day weekend. If a second service is necessary on a particular Sunday, digital formats of video and music will be used.
 - b. Kaylene Kloehn, chair of the Search Committee, reported the committee has been meeting regularly and the process is going well.
5. **Where do we go next**
 - a. Next meeting will be May 3, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. at church
6. **Closing**
 - a. Moderator Clint Micke closed the meeting with an inspirational quote.

CAMP SCHOLARSHIPS

Per our Camp Scholarships Guidelines, our deadline to receive scholarship funds from our fundraising programs is/was May 1st. Camp funds will be divided equally among registered campers. All scholarship funds will be directly sent to the camper's outdoor ministry location.

Families will be notified of their **Camp Scholarship Awards** by **Sunday, May 16th** via email. There will be no in-person scholarship presentations.

If additional financial assistance is needed, families are highly encouraged to contact the church office, Pastor Jeannie, or your Camp Scholarship Committee (CSC) leaders, Karyl Hebel and Tina Clegg. K.I.N.D. Funds are available. If you have any other questions, please contact one of us as soon as possible.

Camp AweSum will be up and running **four** family camps this summer. We are, once again, in need of supplies for these camps. John Wiesner has generously kept us in blue painters tape for our camps, but other needs still exist. We use a lot of sour candies and gum as well as supplies for making giant bubbles for sensory. We use dry erase boards, lots of dry erase markers and supplies for making visuals for communication.

Here are our most pressing needs:

- 3 cases Cry Baby Dubble Bubble gum (Sam's Club online)
- 6 large tubs regular Dubble Bubble gum
- 5 boxes packaged Sour Patch Kids candy from warehouse-type store
- 4 boxes of Starburst packets from warehouse-type store
- Thin or thick dry erase markers, basic colors: red, blue, green, black or all black
- 3 gallons Dawn dishwashing liquid
- 16 35 oz. or larger plastic containers of cornstarch (warehouse-type store)
- 3 lrg. containers baking powder
- 50 AA batteries
- 30 AAA batteries
- Fidgets (fidget spinners, squishy balls, putty, etc.)
- 10 small white boards (approx. 8.5x11 – Walmart carries inexpensive ones)
- 2 reams printer paper
- 1 package white card stock
- Clothespins

A Prayer Shawl is a wrap made with intention and love for a person who is in need of comfort. It is to provide reassurance, solace, or security to a person who is struggling; a shawl can also be given to those who have experienced a recent loss.

I've had an inquiry, or two, by people who would be interested in using their fiber talent, knitting or crocheting—usually, to make such a gift for someone (many times anonymously) in need of comfort. Would you also like to be one of these people?

This is how you can be involved and help:

- Would you be willing to share your talent for the benefit of another by creating a prayer shawl? Your skill level can be as basic as just wanting to learn how to knit or crochet or you may already be able to complete complex pieces: All are welcome, help is available.
- Do you no longer knit or crochet, but have a "stash" of yarn that you would be willing to share? Obviously, all handmade items are a work of love, but their cost is a hidden factor. (That handknit sweater from Great-aunt Adele probably cost her more than twice what you would have paid for it. And that Aran sweater from Uncle Patrick is worth at least a couple hundred dollars—more if made with special yarn!)

Ostrich Ferns ~ 36-48" ~ 3/\$15

Tall Garden Phlox, purple ~ 36-48" ~ 6/\$20

Tawny Daylily, orange ~ 36" ~ 5/\$10

Siberian Iris, deep purple ~ 24-36" ~ 6/\$20

Bearded Iris, purple ~ 24-36" ~ 6/\$20

Yellow Loosestrife ~ 24-36" ~ 5/\$20

Lady's Mantle ~ 24" ~ 3/\$15

Large Variegated Hosta, purple flower ~ 16-20" ~ \$10

Yellow Variegated Hosta, purple flower ~ 12-16" ~ \$10

Dwarf Bearded Iris, plum ~ 8-10" ~ 4/\$20

Ajuga, Burgundy Glow Carpet Bugleweed, groundcover ~ 6-8" ~ \$10

Lily of the Valley ~ 6-8" ~ \$5

Oh, and if you are in need of good, fertile soil to amend your garden dirt, I have 3-year-old composted horse manure available! ~ \$10/5-gallon pail (BYO) or \$50/trash can (BYO)

Of course, all plants can be sold in smaller or larger quantities, depending on your landscape needs. Please use your favorite search engine to research any plants you are unfamiliar with as there are many beautiful photos and in-depth information online. (Please note: all plants will multiply in your yard as well.)

So, please, come and visit me! I will mask if you need me to. Take a walk with me in my yard! Allow me to share my flowers and plants to bring a smile to your yard! And, most importantly, help us raise money for church camp scholarships for our youth campers!
