Dear Members and Friends,

You will continue to speak out so all viewpoints are shared and discussed in order that First Congregational UCC’s ministry will speak to as many people as possible. And now is also the time for even more members to step forward and serve according to their God-given gifts.

As I say good-bye, I want you to know you will be missed. I have both enjoyed your friendship and your support. Know I will continue to pray for you and hold you in my heart. My hope for your church is continued spiritual growth and you continued outreach to this community and beyond. I know God will bless you as you reach into your hearts and touch and love those who you encounter.

And lastly, may God bless you and may God continue to shine God’s light upon you all.

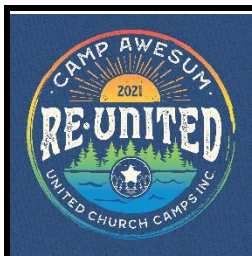

A MESSAGE FROM THE COUNCIL MODERATOR, DAVE THIEL REGATHERING SUNDAY

At the most recent Church Council meeting, on July 12th, the Council voted to have me serve as the Moderator, as a result of Clint Micke's resignation earlier this year. We also accepted and approved Pastor Jeannie's resignation that evening. First of all, I want to say thank you to both Clint and Pastor Jeannie for their leadership during what has been an incredibly challenging period of time for the New London UCC. We are currently working with the UCC Conference to find another interim pastor and will be handling our own pulpit supply with members that have filled-in before (and maybe one or two who have not).

We all know that our church is not in the same place as it was prior to March of 2020, when the decision was made to begin holding services virtually. We have all longed for "that return to normal" over the past 17 months. But as we all know, we can never return to what things were like before. That is not how life works. The world has changed forever as a result of what has happened over these many months.

With that said, we are not in the same place as we were in March of 2020. The incredible work done by the medical professionals who have developed, manufactured and delivered lifesaving vaccines has allowed us to return to our church as we did before: in person. Of course, church service is not the same as it was before. Most of us became accustomed to a different routine on Sunday mornings. Church service is now delivered to us in a very convenient manner, kind of like the way Amazon now delivers essential and non-essential goods to us. We are recruiting some of our most skilled foodies to bring some special items on the 15th. The bottom line. Please join us in person on Sunday, August 15th. We are gathering again.

- 1. Call Meeting To Order:** Vice Moderator Kloehn called the meeting to order at 6:03pm. Pastor Jeannie Douglas opened the meeting with a prayer.
- 2. Discuss Resignation Letter:** Schulz made a motion to accept the resignation of Pastor Jeannie Douglas. Motion seconded by Clegg. Motion carried. The Council will work with church members for pulpit supply and communion. The Moderator and Vice Moderator will work with the UCC WI Conference regarding finding a new interim pastor.
- 3. Ministry Roundtable:** Pastor Jeannie working on books for each Ministry Chair that explain their duties in detail. Each Ministry Committee Chair reported on activities happening in their respective areas.
- 4. Church Council Moderator:** Motion by Schulz to nominate Thiel for Council Moderator. Motion seconded by Clegg. Motion carried.
- 5. Job Descriptions:** Kloehn to update Christian Education Coordinator and Choir Director job descriptions. The jobs will be posted for 10 days, starting on Wednesday, July 14th, and the Council will evaluate candidates at their next meeting on July 26th.
- 6. New Business:** Discussion centered around getting more people to return to Sunday service. The Council agreed to organize a “Regathering Sunday” on August 15th. There will be lots of music during the service and fellowship after.
- 7. Adjournment:** Meeting adjourned at 7:50pm.

MINUTES OF THE UCC CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MONDAY, JULY 26, 2021 6:00PM

UCC Council Members Present: Kaylene Kloehn, Jamie Darkow, Jim Williams, Jerry Schulz and Dave Thiel.

Council Members Absent: Tina Clegg

Others In Attendance: Pastor Jeannie Douglas, Dorea Lauer, Billy Brandt

- 1. Call Meeting To Order:** Moderator Thiel called the meeting to order at 6:00pm. Pastor Jeannie Douglas opened the meeting with a prayer, and then passed out binders for all the Council members containing relevant UCC documents.
- 2. Approve Meeting Minutes of July 12, 2021:** Kloehn made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Motion seconded by Schulz. Motion carried.
- 3. Discussion 2021 & 2022 Budgets:** The Council reviewed the past 5 years of Profit and Loss Statements, in addition to the '21 year-to-date numbers. Discussion took place regarding decreasing revenues over the past three years, in addition to what may be expected in 2022. Discussion also took place around expenses with a focus on how to ensure a balanced budget for this year and next.
- 4. Discussion/Action Regarding Hiring Choir Director & Christian Education Director:** There was one resume submitted for the position of Choir Director. Motion by Thiel to hire Billy Brandt for Choir Director for the amount of money budgeted for 2021 (prorated for the remaining 5 months of work). Motion seconded by Kloehn. Motion carried. There were no resumes submitted for the Christian Education Director position. Kloehn will re-post the position.

5. **Discussion Regathering Sunday:** The Council agreed that this event would take place on Sunday, August 15th in conjunction with the 9am Sunday Service. The Service would feature as many musical groups as possible (e.g., Praise Connection, Bell Choir, Adult or Men's Choir). The event would also feature lots of food after in Fellowship Hall (highlighted by Jamie Darkow's smoked pulled pork!).
6. **Discussion Pulpit Supply:** Thiel informed the Council that he was able to recruit Jan Davis for Communion Sundays. Discussion around additional pulpit supply from church members and the possibility of another interim pastor.
7. **Discussion Regularly Scheduled Council Meetings:** It was agreed that the Council will meet the second Monday of every month at 6pm. The next meeting is August 10, 2021.
8. **New Business:** Motion by Williams to appoint Dorea Lauer as the new Worship Ministry Chair. Motion seconded by Kloehn. Motion carried. Darkow informed the Council regarding snow plowing bids, lighting replacement in Fellowship Hall, and future handrails to help people ascend to the alter.
9. **Adjournment:** Motion by Kloehn to adjourn the meeting. Motion seconded by Darkow. Meeting adjourned at 8:30pm.

The shoes were met by employees of the Cargo Warehouse in Cayo Belize ☺ They were loaded into a huge truck which took them to be loaded onto a barge and sent via water to the Cayo District Cargo Warehouse.

In the absence of the Mission Teams, the Jaguar Scouts will once again be distributing the shoes to the children in the schools/villages in the Cayo District. Each year the Scouts have worked closely with the Mission Groups, they know what needs to be done and how to get the shoes to the students.
