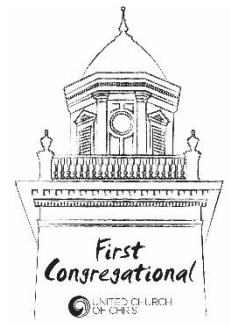




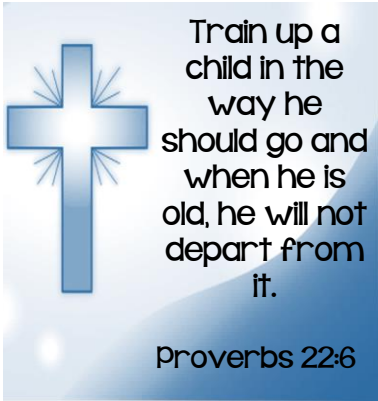

### FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL

We thought it was important to let you know about the conversations and debates we have monthly, sometimes bi-monthly, at our Church Council meetings. Yes, we release the minutes from those meetings, but the minutes are unable to capture the deliberations and discussions we have before we reach our decisions. First of all, we want to highlight our intentions as we serve in these positions. We all want to do whatever we can to help First Congregational UCC New London make it to the other side of what has been one of the most challenging times in its history. We do not pretend that there were no other extremely difficult times for this church throughout its existence, but we do think that this time it was somewhat of a perfect storm that occurred (for which there was no playbook to guide us).

We are also fully aware that this storm has not ended. However, as with all life-changing events, there are moments that happen where you realize that things are moving forward, getting better. For us, it was our most recent Council meeting on August 9<sup>th</sup>. The meeting began with all the angst and uncertainty that has been the hallmark of this crisis. However, it ended with us all feeling that for the first time in a long time that we had made progress which will help our church get to the other side. In between was lots of honest sharing of ideas and negotiation. The kind that occurs when groups are working toward a goal much more important than their own.

One of the key things that made us feel we are moving forward is that we had two qualified young people step forward to apply for the open staff positions of Choir Director and Christian Education Director. Even before the pandemic began it was clear that UCC New London, like lots of churches, organizations, and businesses, needed to begin the transfer of leadership positions to the next generations. The current church council is a good start toward that end, and the hiring of Katelyn Schmidt as the new Christian Education Director and Billy Brandt as the new Choir Director are further evidence that we are transitioning to the future.

The second key thing that made us believe we are moving toward the next chapter in the Church's history is the progress that has been made by the Pastoral Search Committee. Please read their article in this month's newsletter for further details. In addition, the number of people that have stepped forward to provide Sunday Service Pulpit Supply has been a reminder of how much folks believe in the importance that UCC New London serves in the lives of its members and the community.

The final thing that gave us a big boost was the turnout for "Regathering Sunday". We had twice as many people show up for Service on Sunday, August 15<sup>th</sup> (as compared to our numbers since we reopened). To say it was heartwarming to see the turnout and share fellowship again with friends we have not seen for months is an understatement. And we received a call from the UCC Conference that they may have a new interim pastor for us starting in October! We all know there will still be bumps along the way, but we can see the other side. Thank you for all of your support.

# MINUTES OF THE UCC CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

## MONDAY, AUGUST 9, 2021 – 6:00 P.M.

UCC Council Members Present: Kaylene Kloehn-Pluger, Jamie Darkow, Jim Williams, Jerry Schulz, Tina Clegg and Dave Thiel.

Council Members Absent: Dorea Lauer

- 1. Call Meeting To Order:** Moderator Thiel called the meeting to order at 6:00pm, and then opened the meeting with a prayer.
- 2. Approve Meeting Minutes of July 26, 2021:** Kloehn-Pluger made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Motion seconded by Schulz. Motion carried.
- 3. Ministry Reports/Discussion:** This week, the UCC Search Committee will submit its initial profile (to hire a new pastor) to the WI UCC Conference for review.
- 4. Discussion/Action Regarding Hiring Christian Education Director:** There was one resume submitted for the position of Christian Education Director. Motion by Kloehn-Pluger to hire Katelyn Schmidt for the Christian Education Director, position to start on August 16, 2021, for the amount of money budgeted for 2021 (prorated for the remaining 4 & 1/2 months of work). Motion seconded by Clegg. Motion carried.
- 5. Discussion Regathering Sunday:** Sunday, August 15<sup>th</sup> has been designated as Regathering Sunday. The Service will feature music by the Praise Connection Band & Bell Choir. Fellowship time features smoked pulled pork, smoked salmon, salads and desert.
- 6. Discussion Pulpit Supply:** Motion by Williams to pay Pulpit Supply Pastor Jan Davis \$200 per Sunday plus mileage. Motion seconded by Schulz. Motion carried.
- 7. Discussion Financial Statements/Budget:** Review of budget for various expense categories.
- 8. New Business:** Motion by Schulz to increase the wage for the Secretary to \$17/hour, the wage for the Custodian to \$15/hour, and the wage for the Bookkeeper to \$15/hour, effective the week of August 16, 2021. Motion also includes a formal review for each position by members of the Council to occur over the next month. Motion seconded by Darkow. Motion carried. Motion by Williams to sign lease for new copier based on the \$265.96/month for 60 months quote from MBM (aka Modern Business Machines). Motion seconded by Schulz. Motion carried. Motion by Kloehn-Pluger to send UCC newsletter to members via mail, starting in September. Motion seconded by Clegg. Motion carried. Motion by Darkow to hire Pederson Lawn Care & Snow Removal for \$85/hour for plowing; \$25/hour for shoveling; \$15/hour for salting the UCC parking lot this winter. Motion seconded by Clegg. Motion carried.
- 9. Adjournment:** Kloehn-Pluger, in the spirit of former Moderator Clint Micke, closed the meeting with a quote (from Martin Luther King). **"The ultimate measure of a person is not where he or she stands in the moments of comfort and convenience, but where she or he stands in times of challenge and controversy."** Motion by Williams to adjourn the meeting. Motion seconded by Darkow. Meeting adjourned at 8:15pm.
