


FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

IF I HAD MY LIFE TO LIVE OVER

In my preparations for Mother's Day worship this past year, I came across a wonderful column from humorist Erma Bombeck. That's a name that is familiar to those of my Baby Boomer generation and should be more familiar to those of younger generations. In her own way, she was a groundbreaker, sharing her unique perspective while celebrating all of us who toil over the everyday tasks of life while trying to be a better caregiver to the precious ones in our care. I thought this column would be a good one to carry us into summer when the pace of our lives perhaps slows a bit and provides us time to think more deeply.

"If I had my life to live over...

I would have gone to bed when I was sick instead of pretending the earth would go into a holding pattern if I weren't there for the day.

I would have burned the pink candle sculpted like a rose before it melted in storage.

I would have talked less and listened more.

I would have invited friends over to dinner even if the carpet was stained, or the sofa faded.

I would have eaten the popcorn in the 'good' living room and worried much less about the dirt when someone wanted to light a fire in the fireplace.

I would have taken the time to listen to my grandfather ramble about his youth.

I would have shared more of the responsibility carried by my husband.

I would never have insisted the car windows be rolled up on a summer day because my hair had just been teased and sprayed.

I would have sat on the lawn with my children and not worried about grass stains.

I would have cried and laughed less while watching television and more while watching life.

I would never have bought anything just because it was practical, wouldn't show soil, or was guaranteed to last a lifetime.

Instead of wishing away nine months of pregnancy, I'd have cherished every moment and realized that the wonderment growing inside me was the only chance in life to assist God in a miracle.

When my kids kissed me impetuously, I would never have said, "Later. Now go get washed up for dinner."

There would have been more "I love you's." More "I'm sorry's."

But mostly, given another shot at life, I would seize every minute...look at it and really see it ... live it ... and never give it back. "

This column was written in 1979 after Erma found out that she was dying from cancer. Her words continue to challenge and bless us all.

NEW AED

Our new AED is now registered and in place in the narthex. This new technology does not need maintenance or certified users. Anyone can use this device if you feel comfortable. No training is required, just open the door of the box, pull out the AED and push the ON button and a voice will direct you through the steps. The separate black zipper case contains some CPR accessories and a scissors to cut clothes.

To feel more comfortable, please go to YouTube and type into the search: Heartsine 360P Defibrillator.

This short video will walk you through an event that uses the 360P so you can be more familiar with the commands that are given. If you are a person that feels they could help in a health crisis, please make yourself more comfortable by watching the training video. Any questions should be directed to Lois Cuff. Thank you for the incredible response to the pantry Pastor Carwash Challenge. The winner is truly the people that use the pantry each week. Our donations generally consist of food items but there is a great need for laundry detergent, shampoo, dish soap and other household products.

Summer is approaching and that means school will soon be out. Lots of kids will not be getting their lunches at school anymore. Our challenge for the summer is kid noon meals. Peanut butter and jelly, individual size fruit cups, jello, pudding and cold cereal.

Last month 157 households used the pantry. They can come every other week. Each person receives on average 12 pounds of food per visit. As you can see, we go through a lot of food. Your support of this mission is truly needed and appreciated. Thank you. You are a blessing to our church and community.

FIRST CONGREGATIONAL UCC IS 5 FOR 5

First Congregational continues to be a 5 for 5 Congregation, giving to the United Church of Christ's four Special Mission Offerings as well as OCWM (Our Church's Wider Mission).

- OCWM: Gifts from congregations like ours to OCWM Basic Support make it possible for the Wisconsin Conference to support and strengthen local churches. The Conference primarily does this by providing resources and guidance. But the Conference also connects us to the wider church, including our international partners. In 2023 First Congregational gave \$3,575.00 towards OCWM.
- ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING: Gifts from OGHS channels resources for international programs in health, education and agricultural development, emergency relief, refugee ministries, and both international and domestic disaster response, administered by Wider Church Ministries, Global Sharing of Resources. In 2023 First Congregational gave \$2,049.05 towards OGHS.
- STRENGTHEN THE CHURCH: Gifts from STC re-imagines and builds the future of the UCC. Shared at the conference and national levels, Strengthen the Church largely supports youth ministries and fulltime leaders for new churches in parts of the country where the United Church of Christ does not have a strong presence. It also provides support for existing church's new initiatives. In 2023 First Congregational gave \$1,373.00 towards Strengthen the Church.
- NEIGHBORS IN NEED: Gifts from NIN supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States, including the Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM), justice and advocacy, and direct service projects supported by Justice and Local Church Ministries. In 2023 First Congregational gave \$1,773.00 towards NIN.
- THE CHRISTMAS FUND: The Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund is a Special Mission Offering that congregations have been supporting for over 100 years. The offering is administered through the United Church Board for Ministerial Assistance, the charitable arm of the Pension Boards. Funds provide direct financial support to those who serve the church and are facing financial difficulties. Active and retired clergy, lay employees, and their surviving spouses may be eligible for the Supplementation of Small Annuities, Supplementation of Health Premiums, Emergency Grants, and/or Christmas "Thank You" Gift Checks. In 2023 First Congregational gave \$1,502.00 towards the Christmas Fund.
