


FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK UNITY AND THE GAMES

If you can (for the moment) give up watching the latest Cats-Playing-the-Piano video on YouTube, I want you to check out the hilarious 2012 recording of the parents of American Olympic gymnast Alexandra Raisman watching their daughter perform her floor routine during the Olympic Games held in London. (Here's the link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hv357oqlZ2I) They twist and turn in their seats, grimacing sympathetically, blurting out words of advice and encouragement that obviously couldn't reach their daughter tumbling half a gymnasium away. Their behavior reminded us that the umbilical cord may have been cut long ago, but the connection between parents and daughter remained.

Part of my laughter at the Raisman's is a laughter of recognition. I can remember being on the sidelines watching one of our daughters playing soccer and sympathetically contorting myself so much that I fell to the ground. Most disturbing is the fact that, at first, I didn't even notice that I had fallen because I had never taken my eyes off my daughter.

Parents have such a deep sense of connection with their children. That's what we learn from the Raisman's, but that doesn't explain why so many of us will have our eyes glued to the Olympic Games in the days to come. Watching T.V., I will twist and turn for a fencer from Taiwan. I will clean and jerk with a female weightlifter from Turkey. The Olympics teach us that our connection runs deeper than simply family.

I can still remember grabbing my head sympathetically in 1988 when American Olympic diver Greg Louganis hit his head on the diving board in competition. Thirty minutes, one concussion, and five stitches later he climbed the stairs over the pool again and executed a perfect, gold-medal-winning dive. Like many around the world, I jumped to my feet. We are connected to one another as fellow humans on this planet, fellow children of God.

Isn't that what Jesus was hoping for when he prayed to God in John's Gospel that humanity "may all be one, even as you and I are one"? Isn't that the unity we hope to experience in the Olympic Games?

A few years ago at the Seattle Special Olympics, nine contestants, all physically or mentally disabled, assembled at the starting line for the 100-yard dash. At the gun they all started out, not exactly in a dash, but with the relish of running the race to the finish with hopes of winning; all, that is, except one boy who stumbled on the asphalt, tumbled over a couple of times, and began to cry. The other eight heard the boy cry. They slowed down and paused. Then they all turned around and went back - every one of them. One girl with Down's syndrome bent down and kissed him and said, "*This will make it better*." Then all nine linked arms and walked together to the finish line.

Everyone in the stadium jumped to their feet, and their cheering went on for 10 solid minutes. They cheered as one people connected to one another as fellow children of God on this planet. May God be praised for unity!

- 1. Call to Order at 6:02pm/Roll Call Council Members Present: Dorea Brandt, Pete Lauer, Sherie Bressler, Steve Savides, Lois Cuff, and Dave Thiel. Guests: Billy Brandt.
- 2. Opening Prayer by Pastor Steve Savides.
- 3. Approve Meeting Minutes from May 13, 2024 Minutes from the May 13, 2024, meeting where not distributed and will be reviewed and approved at the August meeting.
- 4. Pastor's Reports Pastor Steve provided the Council with a written report of the various activities he has been working on over the past month, as well as highlights from all of the activities that occurred in the Church over the past month. He covered the following topics: Worship Service Highlights; Worship Schedule for July & August; Community Outreach; Larger Church Outreach.
- 5. Financial Reports Discussion regarding current financial reports.
- 6. Resignation of Sunday School Teacher A special and grateful thank you goes out to Wendy Dallman for all of the time, effort and love she put into providing opportunities for our young people to receive religious education. She provided an important transition for our church after the pandemic, and we were very fortunate to have her skills and experience guiding this program. The Church Council is committed to providing our children with meaningful religious experiences and educational opportunities. Council member Dorea Brandt will lead a small committee that will put together a plan for moving forward.
- 7. Facility Repair & Upgrade Projects Lois Cuff put together a packet of information detailing the various repair and upgrade projects that need to be addressed at the church. With the failure of one of the projectors used during services as well as the air conditioning in the offices and fellowship hall, the need to repair one of our very old boilers before wintertime and fix another leak in the roof, the Council has begun the process of putting together a 3-year capital plan which will address all of the numerous repair and upgrade projects that require our attention. The current church members are the stewards of this beautiful facility, as well as the congregation charged with continuing the long and rich history of First Congregational UCC New London (167 years and counting). Since many of the projects involve significantly more money than the \$10,000 the Church Council is authorized to approve without a Congregational meeting, we will put together a recommended plan of action and submit that to the Congregation for discussion and approval.
- 8. New Business The Praise Band will be celebrating 25 years of providing music for UCC services with a recognition Sunday in September.
- 9. Adjournment Motion by Lois Cuff to adjourn. Motion seconded by Pete Lauer. The meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 8:02 p.m.

HAPPY 25TH ANNIVERSARY PRAISE CONNECTION

Music has always been an enhancement tool for community worship and over hundreds of years the popular music of the times found its way into worship services. It is hard to believe that 25 years ago we began our journey of contemporary Christian music to enrich our worship services.

Time for some reminiscing......August 8, 1999 was the first contemporary worship service at our church called Praise Connection.....we are 25 years old!! It is amazing we have been producing praise music consistently for all those years.

Just a few facts:

- Fall of 1997 planning began for contemporary worship
- > Summer of 1998 a weeklong training in Minneapolis was attended
- Fall of 1998 equipment was purchased and some music arrangements were selected
- > January 1999 band musicians began to rehearse with singers joining them in May
- ➤ August 8, 1999, was the first Praise Connection service at 10:30 a.m. Sunday mornings
- ➤ June 4, 2000 PC moved to 6:30 p.m. Sunday rights
- May 6, 2001, PC moved to 9:00 a.m. Sunday morning alternating with traditional service
- > September 9, 2001, PC was placed at 8:00 a.m. with traditional service at 10:10 a.m.
- March 15, 2020, final PC service due to COVID-19 shut down
- March 28, 2021, return to PC Service, 9:00 a.m. every other Sunday

We have been through many adjustments and changes in format, always adding new songs and new musicians and are still a vibrant part of Sunday worship 25 years later. We have had 2 keyboardists, 5 drummers, 6 bass players, one guitarist, one harmonica player, one sound tech and 42 different singers rotating through.

Starting with slides and projectors manually operated to our present media shout computerized program with automatic projection.....many equipment upgrades, sound system upgrades and designs.... technology has pushed us forward.

A BIG THANK YOU to all involved from sound board operators, slide projector and media shout operators, media shout song input assistants, tech assistants, instrumentalist and singers, all those who help with setup and tear down of the equipment....thank you all for keeping this effort alive and meaningful as a music option here at the UCC.
