FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"New Every Morning"

I can remember in my High School Economics class learning about one of advertisers' favorite tactics: "Ain't It Awful!" The "Ain't It Awful" pitch tries to prey on your natural concerns and fears in order to sell you something. Apparently, once they get your head shaking and your sense of outrage rising, then you will be susceptible to giving them your money (or your vote!). Think of the movies and television shows that begin with bloody murders or horrifying tragedies to grab your attention and steal your time. Think of the politicians who claim we are in a time of emergency in hopes that you might give them emergency powers. Preachers can be the worst of the "Ain't It Awful" pitchers as they try to convince you that the world is going to hell in a handbasket and only they and their church have the heavenly cure.

Contrast those who sound the drumbeat of doom with the bold proclamation of the prophet in the book of Lamentations. In the midst of a truly difficult time of defeat, famine, and exile, the prophet pauses to proclaim:

The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, God's mercies never come to an end; They are new every morning... (Lamentations 3:22-23)

Even in the most difficult times, the prophet sees reasons to hope and, by hoping, endure.

The fact of the matter is that there are so many mercies happening around us all the time. I've been delighted to discover The Progress Network, a weekly newsletter that shares hopeful facts that are indications of progress all around us. Did you know, for example...?

- The most common causes of premature death—including murder, overdoses, car crashes, and obesity—are all declining.
 - o Homicides have plummeted since the pandemic, and the nation's murder rate may set a record low in 2025.
 - o The CDC reported an unprecedented annual decline in drug overdose deaths this year.
 - Traffic deaths have declined for 12 straight quarters, and the latest fatality rate is the lowest in six years.
 - Obesity decreased in the most recent analysis for the first time in more than a decade, as GLP-1 drugs continue to improve.

And did you know that...?

- The divorce rate is at a 50 year low in our country.
- Americans are exercising more now than ever before.
- Only 54% of Americans say they drink alcohol, the lowest on record since 1939.
- 13.4 million Mexicans were lifted out of poverty between 2018 and 2024
- The amount of oil spilled worldwide from tankers nowadays is less than one-thirtieth of the amount in the 1970s.
- Helsinki has gone a full year without a traffic death, the result of lower speed limits, more traffic cameras, and better infrastructure for pedestrians and cyclists.

All of these facts are reported in the latest weekly report from the Progress Network. And all of these give the lie to those who try to lull us into submissive despair with their "Ain't It Awful" pitches.

In fact, the prophet was right. God's mercies never come to an end. They are new every morning. And every morning we can rise with new hope and joy and determination to join in God's faithful work among us.

WORSHIP AT OUR CHURCH, 2025-26

"... to all who received him... he gave power to become children of God." (John 1:12)

So many of us feel powerless in these present times. Political, economic, and social power seem a thing now reserved for the wealthy, the chosen, the "fabulous" few. More than ever, we are tempted to pull inward, turn away from our high calling, and despair about the future. John's Gospel brings us a word of power, a word of hope through Jesus Christ, the Word of God. As it says in the first chapter of John, we who follow Christ are given "power to become children of God."

Much of this upcoming worship year will focus on John's Gospel as we follow the **Narrative Lectionary**. Fall will bring us a quick overview of critical Old Testament texts, Advent will focus on Isaiah (the prophet of Advent), Luke will provide our Christmas texts, and then, for the bulk of the church year, we will embark on a systematic journey through John's Gospel. At the end of our worship year, we will be blessed by a focus on Paul's letter to the church at Philippi.

Our **Adult Study Class** will focus on John's Gospel with 12 sessions on this longest of the Gospels split between 6 weeks in fall (November 5-19 and December 3-17) and 6 weeks in Lent (February 18 – March 25). Besides using the Narrative Lectionary, there will be several other **special worship opportunities** during our worship year:

- We will have three **Ecumenical Worship Services** on November 26 (Thanksgiving Eve service), February 18 (Ash Wednesday) and April 3 (Good Friday).
- **Stewardship Sunday** will be observed on November 9 with special Stewardship speakers offering brief reflections in worship the three Sundays prior.
- **Christmas Eve** will see our traditional live nativity service at 4 pm and an evening Christmas Eve service at 7 pm.
- We'll again be celebrating **Heritage Sunday** in early February as we observe the anniversary of our church's founding.
- We will focus on our various **Church Mission Projects** during the six Sundays in Lent (February 22 March 29).
- We will be observing **Maundy Thursday** on April 2 and Holy **Humor Sunday** will make its appearance again after Easter.
- Our program year will close, as usual, with **Pentecost Sunday** on May 24.

We hope and pray this next worship year will be a blessing on our congregation and grant us the power and clarity to be God's children in this world.

- 1. Call to Order at 6:02pm/Roll Call Council Members Present: Tina Clegg, Lois Cuff, Sherie Bressler, Dorea Brandt and Dave Thiel. Staff Members Present: Billy Brandt
- 2. Opening Prayer by Lois Cuff.
- 3. Approve Meeting Minutes from May 12, 2025 Motion by Lois Cuff to approve the minutes from May 12, 2025. Motion seconded by Dorea Brandt. Motion carried 5-0.
- 4. Financial Reports Discussion regarding current status of operating budget and balance sheet. Motion by Dorea Brandt to approve the Financial Reports as submitted. Motion seconded by Tina Clegg. Motion carried 5-0.
- 5. Adult Choir Billy Brandt has submitted his resignation as Adult Choir Director, effective August 31, 2025. The Council thanked him for his years of service and expressed their appreciation that he will continue as the Bell Choir Director. Motion made by Tina Clegg to accept Billy Brandt's resignation as Adult Choir Director. Motion seconded by Sherie Bressler. Motion carried 5-0. 
