

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK "God Is Still Speaking"

One of the great marriages of the 20th Century was that between two comedians: George Burns and Gracie Allen. A wonderfully funny team on-stage and loving partners off-stage, they were married for 40 years.

When Burns first met Gracie, she was 17 years old and, like George, an aspiring vaudevillian. Glass fragments from an exploding hurricane lamp had left her with one eye that appeared green and the other blue; another childhood accident had scalded and permanently scarred her left arm. But Burns, who was divorced and 10 years her senior, saw a partnership. "She could sing and she could dance and she was willing to work cheap," he wrote. "Who cared how old she was?"

George Burns was fond of saying, "For 40 years my act consisted of one joke. Then she died." He made no secret of how grief-stricken he was after Gracie died. "When I miss her a great deal, I crawl in on her side of the bed, in the middle of the day even. I stay there until I feel warm and good, and then I go on about my business."

In the midst of his grief, Burns found a note from Gracie. This is what it said: "Never place a period where God has placed a comma. Love, Gracie." That is how Gracie Allen told her husband George, even after she died, that he still had a future. God would make it possible.

The season of Lent is a time to remember and rekindle our resurrection faith. Even death is not a period in our lives. Through God, it is only a comma, a pause, maybe even a period of silent reflection before God speaks again. At the foot of the Cross, from the dawning of the empty tomb, we proclaim that through every passage of our life, through every hope and possibility for the future, God is still speaking.

COUNCIL MODERATOR'S REPORT

With my article for this year's February Newsletter & the 2025 Annual Report, I will be reviewing the major focus of 2025, as well as presenting the Council's proposed 2026 budget. This year we continued to concentrate on being good stewards of the Church building that has served members and the community for the past 169 years. We completed all of the capital improvement projects approved by the Congregation in September of 2024. The following information lays out the current financial details regarding those projects.

As we have witnessed many times, the members of UCC New London respond to the Church's needs, as well as the Community's. In just over one year, we have reduced the debt for the capital improvement projects to \$34,754.16. And, as we reduce that debt, we reduce the amount of money paid by the Operating Budget to cover the monthly principal and interest payments made to First State Bank.

Based on the past three years of data, the Church Council will propose a deficit

budget of \$8,696.06 for 2026 at the Annual Meeting on February 15, 2026, after the Sunday service (approximately 10:00). There will be several items on the agenda, including approval of the minutes from last year's Annual Meeting, a progress report on the Capital Improvement Projects, a decision regarding the Church's vacant lot property, the 2026 Proposed Budget, and the election of members to the Church Council for 2026-27. We need to elect two members to the Church Council. The two current Council members, whose terms have expired, have agreed to serve for another 2-year term, if approved by the Congregation. If any other church member is interested in serving on the Church Council, please submit your name to our Church Secretary, Eryka Lauer, prior to the Annual Meeting. And, if any church member would like to discuss any of the agenda items in advance of the Annual Meeting, please contact one of the Council members.

UCC CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING

JANUARY 19, 2026 – 6:00PM - COUNCIL MINUTES

1. Call to Order at 6:10pm/Roll Call – Council Members Present: Lois Cuff, Pastor Steve Savides, Pete Lauer, Sherie Bressler and Dave Thiel.
2. Opening Prayer by Pastor Steve Savides.
3. Approve Meeting Minutes From December 15, 2025 – Motion by Lois Cuff to approve the minutes from December 15, 2025. Motion seconded by Pete Lauer. Motion carried unanimously.
4. Pastor's Report - Pastor Steve Savides discussed portions of his written report of the various activities he has been working on over the past month, as well as highlights from all of the activities that occurred in the Church over the past month. The report covered the following topics: Worship Service Highlights for the past month; Scheduled Worship activities for January & February; Adult Bible Study; Mission Church Activities; Activities in the Larger Church & Community.
5. Financial Reports – Discussion regarding current status of the operating budget.
6. Vacant Lot Discussion – Lois Cuff reported on the Council-authorized meeting with the New London School District regarding the vacant lot owned by the Church. Lois will present all of the background information to the Church membership for a discussion, during the Annual Meeting on February 15th.
7. Facility & Operations Report – Lois Cuff provided an update on the following projects: the current total of contributions received for Project Revive; working with local insurance company to acquire quotes for Commercial & Workers Compensation Insurance; the most recent elevator inspection which resulted in the directive to use the elevator as much as possible; an update on how all improvement projects are working very well; the tuck pointing project scheduled for 2026.
8. Proposed 2026 Budget – After a discussion regarding the final numbers proposed operating budget numbers for 2026, Sherie Bressler made a motion to approve submitting the 2026 Proposed Budget to the Church Membership, for a discussion and vote, at the 2026 Annual Meeting on February 15, 2026. Motion seconded by Lois Cuff. Motion carried unanimously.
9. 2026 Annual Meeting – Discussion regarding the agenda items for the UCC Annual Meeting, which will take place on Sunday, February 15, 2026, immediately following the Sunday Service (approximately 10:00am).
10. 2026 Council Candidates – Discussion regarding current members interest in continuing to serve as members of the UCC New London Church Council.
11. New Business - None
12. Adjournment – Motion by Pastor Steve Savides to adjourn. Motion seconded by Dave Thiel. The meeting was adjourned at 7:15pm.

VACANT LOT SALE? – SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

We are in discussions with the New London Public School District regarding the sale of our vacant lot... they are interested in buying it.

This item will be on our Annual Meeting agenda for discussion.

Background on our vacant lot:

We purchased this lot (60' by 120') in 2009 for \$81,500.00. This lot has access to E Washington Street. At that time there was one 2 story house and unattached garage on the site. By the fall of 2010 that house and garage were razed. At that time this lot was purchased for future use such as expansion or more parking. It is zoned tax exempt because we own it.

In 2009 there were 2 other residential lots of similar size next door to the one we purchased. The New London School District purchased both of those lots to create a green space for Lincoln Elementary School shortly after we made our purchase.

Seventeen years later... we have not built on this lot and the school district is interested in purchasing it to expand their green space. We have turned to Century 21 Sandy DuFrane for a property evaluation. She advised us that we will never get what we paid for it, but it does have a monetary value. There is no residential zoning in that small area so it would be very difficult to sell it with a goal of building a house. We have our garbage dumpsters on this lot presently, however, we are not making much garbage. We could downsize to residential 90 gallon bins and probably get by.

Dave Thiel and I have met with a representative of the NLSD to discuss our concerns. There is no specific timeline just a serious interest.

Please bring your questions and concerns to the annual meeting on February 15, 2026, for a discussion regarding our interest to sell.
